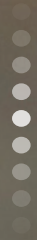

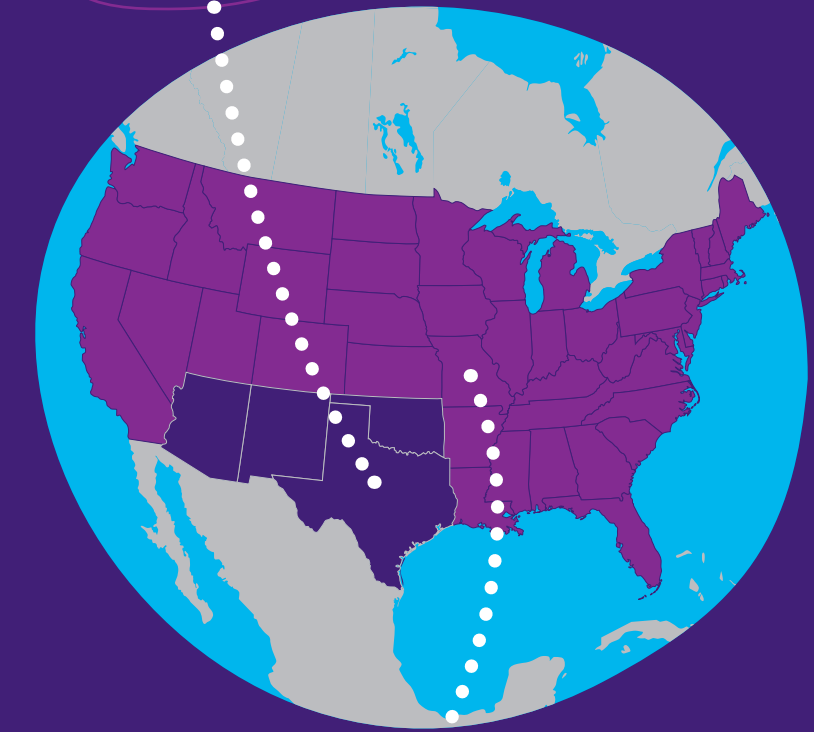

OUR MULTIDISCIPLINARY CONTINUUM OF CARE

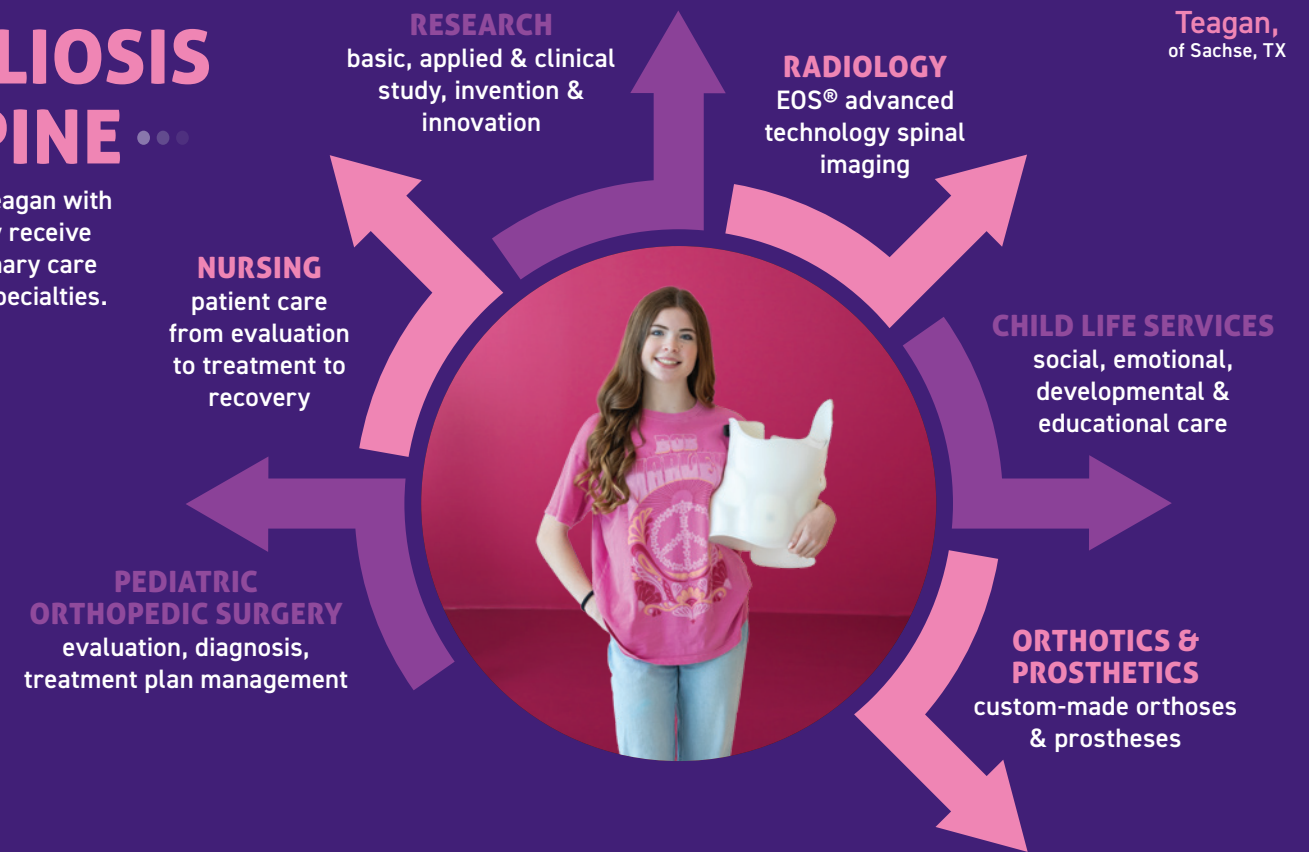
As the sound of the piano fills the atrium and the aroma of popcorn wafts down the halls, a patient family checks in for their child's appointment. They notice the colorful floors and art-lined walls. No hospital carts or white coats are in sight. But deep within the clinic core, an inner world buzzes with activity.

A multidisciplinary team has assembled to prepare for the child's appointment. A doctor, advanced practice provider, nurse, therapist, researcher, fellow and other specialists discuss the child's condition, reviewing the chart, X-rays and treatment plan. Beyond this appointment, a host of in-house specialists await, including anesthesiologists, child life specialists, dentists, orthotists, pharmacists, physical and occupational therapists, prosthetists, psychologists, radiologists, rheumatologists and more. The child's needs determine the team, whose depth and breadth of expertise combine to provide a collaborative continuum of care.

Here, we highlight our multidisciplinary approach, using Complex Care, Scoliosis & Spine and Sports Medicine as examples.

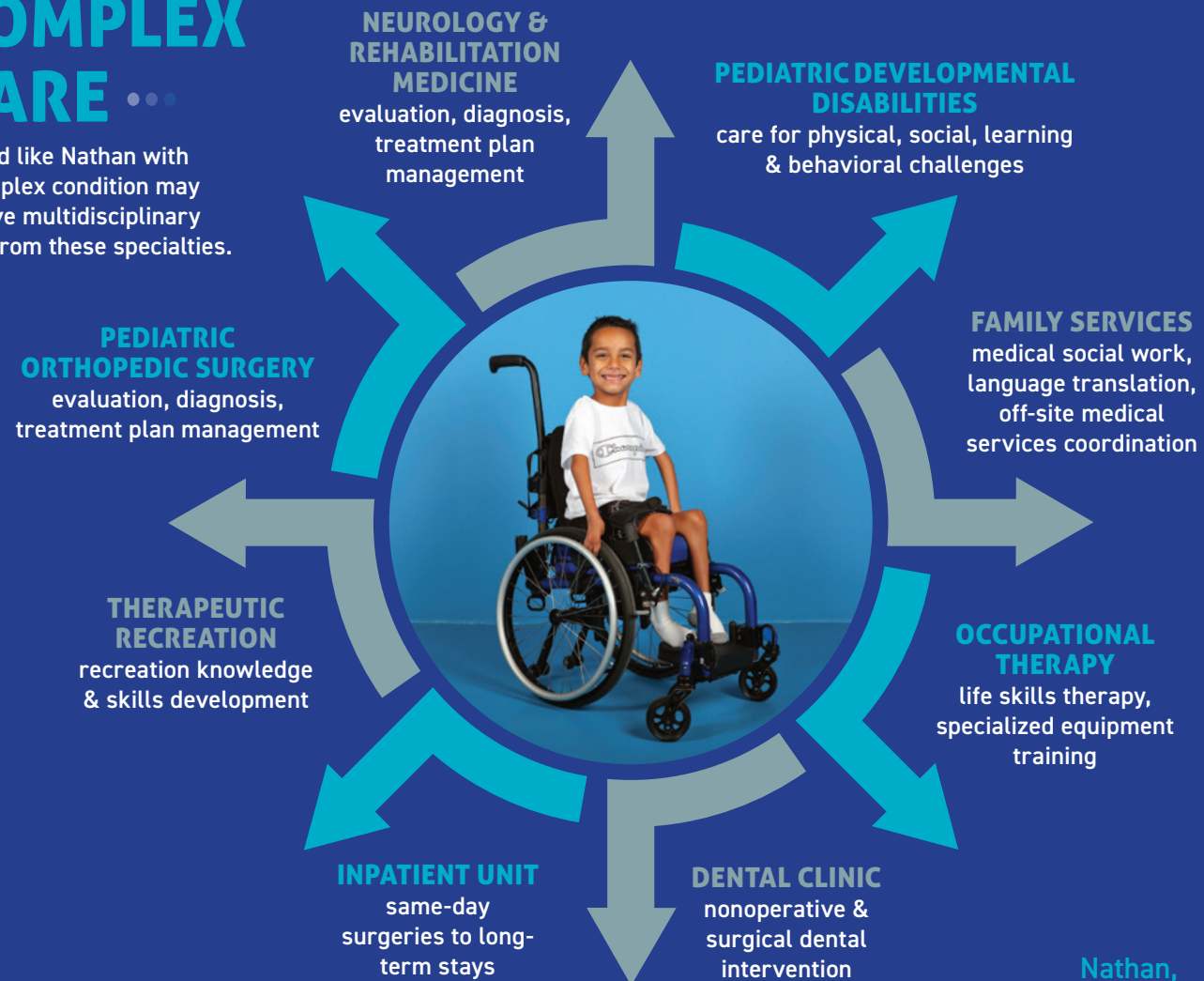
SCOLIOSIS & SPINE

AVA enjoys running track and playing forward on her soccer team. During a soccer game, she broke her wrist and received a short arm waterproof cast from our Fracture Clinic experts at the Scottish Rite for Children Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Center in Frisco. "The care I received was amazing," Ava says. "During the summer, I could even go swimming with my waterproof cast!" And now, Ava is back on the field with her team scoring goals!

BERNARDO was referred to Scottish Rite where specialists diagnosed him with osteoglophonic dysplasia, an extremely rare condition characterized by abnormal bone growth that affects his strength, mobility and balance. Our talented physical therapists have helped Bernardo in each of these areas through aquatic therapy, where he has progressed from doing seated exercises to walking without assistance in the water. "Being correctly diagnosed changed Bernardo's life," says Kátia, his mother. "Scottish Rite has given him quality of life where his physical limitations do not prevent him from being as independent as possible."

JAYLEE loves being with her friends. She enjoys waterparks and making TikTok videos for her fans. Jaylee spent time in the Inpatient Unit where she underwent halo-gravity traction followed by spinal surgery for a severe scoliosis curve that measured almost 90 degrees. "The care she received at Scottish Rite makes me emotional," says Treo, her mother. "Jaylee was cared for, loved and adored. They made us feel like she was top priority, and it changed her life for the better."

MARQUIS was born with symbrachydactyly, a condition in which his right hand and forearm did not fully develop. To ensure that he could participate in any activity he desires, our Prosthetics team customized a prosthetic arm that allows him to complete daily tasks as well as engage in sports. His arm has a quick disconnect wrist that accommodates different hand attachments, including one that can grip the handlebars of a bicycle and even hold a baseball bat. "Scottish Rite was there for my son," says LeChandra, Marquis' mother. "They helped him more than they know."

CEHANNA lives in Belize where she was diagnosed with Blount's disease, a disorder that affects the growth of the tibia bones, which caused her legs to bow outward. After multiple surgeries, Cehanna and her family traveled to Scottish Rite where orthopedic surgeons applied an external fixator to lengthen her left leg, which was two centimeters shorter than her right leg. "Cehanna is excited with the results and can't wait to go back to Belize to flaunt her new looks!" says Araceli, her mother. "Scottish Rite means hope, a dream come true, transformation and a brighter future!"

STEEL was born with bilateral clubfeet. After years of treatment at other health care facilities, he struggled to run without falling, so his family sought a second opinion at Scottish Rite. After learning that his clubfoot had relapsed, they moved to Dallas from Kentucky for two months so that Steel could receive weekly castings and surgery. "Now, Steel is thriving and loves to show everyone his 'straight feet,'" says Ashley, his mother. "He is also enjoying his first year in an organized basketball league."

"SOPHIE is bright, happy and joyful," says Amanda, her mother. After a visit at another health care facility, Scottish Rite experts diagnosed Sophie with developmental dysplasia of the hip — a dislocation of her left hip. Nonoperative treatment was implemented first, using a harness and then a brace. But, her hip was still dislocated, so surgery was scheduled. A month before surgery, an evaluation revealed that Sophie's hip had made progress. While Sophie was under anesthesia, doctors confirmed that her hip was in socket. "It was the best day of our lives," says Amanda and Frank, Sophie's father. "Our prayers were answered. The doctors are unmatched. They treated us like we were their only patient."

"BENJAMIN is sweet, friendly and funny," says Jurith, his mother. He loves playing with his toy trains and watching *Numberblocks*, an animated show that teaches kids how to count, add and subtract. Benjamin was diagnosed with lupus, a chronic autoimmune disease that causes inflammation throughout the body. Our pediatric rheumatologists provide individualized care for Benjamin, customizing a treatment plan to meet his specific needs. "My son is in very good hands," Jurith says. "I am thankful to God and Scottish Rite for being there for my son's care."

SCARLETTE started gymnastics at age 4 and later dreamed of joining the Rutgers gymnastics team in college. In high school, she tripped while running into a tumbling pass and landed on her arm, injuring the ulnar collateral ligament in her left elbow. After undergoing surgery and physical therapy at the Scottish Rite for Children Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Center in Frisco, Scarlette returned to gymnastics and was invited to join the team at Rutgers. "Scottish Rite took amazing care of me through this difficult journey," Scarlette says. "It made this whole experience one that I will always be thankful for!"

"The program works," Penny says. "His teachers were the right mix of love and expectation, which, coupled with the curriculum, led to Seth's success."

RUTHIE MAE calls Scottish Rite the "fun doctor." After adopting Ruthie Mae at age 3, her parents learned that she had spina bifida and hydrocephalus, a buildup of fluid in the brain. Since then, Ruthie Mae has received a continuum of care from Scottish Rite specialists in Neurology as well as Orthopedics, Orthotics, Urology, Physical Therapy and Dental. "They have helped us to navigate surgeries, wean off medications, learn to walk and improve Ruthie Mae's daily life," says Jayme, her mother.
